

Give the name and show the location of adjacent streets, railroads, canals, rivers, buildings, lot lines, etc. The distance to the nearest cross road or street must be shown or stated.

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Labor Law Definitions

“Place of public assembly” includes a theater, a moving picture house, and assembly halls maintained or leased for monetary gain where one hundred or more people may assemble for amusement or recreation (Section 2.12, NYS Labor Law).
 Not included are halls owned by churches, religious organizations, granges and public association and free libraries as defined under Section 253 of the NYS Education Law, and hotels having 50 or more rooms.

“Viewing stand” means a bleacher, grandstand or similar structure used at carnivals, fairs, and amusement parks for public occupation with a capacity of 100 or more people and which may have accidental personal injuries occur during its assembly, disassembly, or use (Section 870-c.12, NYS Labor Law).

“Tent” means a tent with a capacity for 300 or more people used at carnivals, fairs and amusement parks (Section 870-c.15, NYS Labor Law).

Filing Requirements

No fee is required with this application.

Filing plans and applications is required for tents and viewing stands subject to Section 870 of the NYS Labor Law and for new or altered buildings to be used as places of public assembly **unless** the location is

- New York City,
- other cities that have a bureau of buildings charged with enforcing a building code enacted by the legislative body of the city, or
- in a city, town or village which has assumed responsibility under Section 472 of the NYS Labor Law

Architect’s Seal and Signature

The seal and signature of a New York Registered Architect or Professional Engineer are required on the plans.
