During the anticipated period of employment, the primary activity on this farm will be the hand harvest of apples. Workers drive and operate farm machinery to plant, cultivate, spray and harvest of apples. Removes excess growth from trees to improve fruit quality using pruning saws and clippers. Workers drive tractors to transport materials, supplies, or product. Also, thin blossoms or immature fruit to obtain better quality fruit. Other harvesting fruit or other job duties, if required.

Workers must be physically able to pick fruit, most of which is done from ladders with lower branches being picked from the ground. Workers place ladder firmly against or within tree in a secure position so as not to break limbs or knock off fruit and to prevent slipping or falling. All fruit to be handled with care to avoid causing bruising. Picked fruit is placed in a metal-framed, canvas-covered picking bucket with canvas straps that slip over the head and rest on the shoulders. The bucket when filled weighs up to 42 lbs. and is emptied into bulk boxes known as "tote boxes". Each tote box has a capacity of twenty (20) bushels. Workers are required to handle ladders up to 24 feet long and weighing about 2 lbs. per foot. In apple harvest work, workers may be instructed to selectively pick mature fruit according to size, color, and grade standards factors. Workers will be directed to strip all fruit from tree at one picking or to spot pick (selective picking) according to size and color depending on crop conditions and state of maturity. Fruit picked as drops is never mixed with tree fruit. Productivity must be at least 4.8 bins per day for fresh market apples and 6.75 bins per day for processing apples. Each worker's picked fruit will be inspected according to instructions given each day by the orchard foreman.

Workers also perform any combination of tasks involved in planting, cultivating and harvesting of fruits such as tilling soil, planting stock, pruning trees and bushes, removing suckers and runners from trees, vines and plants. Other duties include laying out irrigation pipe and installing sprinklers, assisting in repairing fences, unloading trucks, clearing fields, burning brush, hand thinning fruit and smudging. Will use appropriate tools such as shovels, hoes, tampers, pruning hooks and shears.

Employer will furnish to workers, without cost, all tools and equipment required in the performance of the duties assigned. Workers should report for work with their own suitable work clothing. Field temperatures may range from 30 degrees to 85 degrees with possible wet morning conditions. All applicants will be required to have three months experience in all duties outlined in this job order.

Durante el periodo previsto de empleo, la principal actividad en esta comunidad será la mano cosecha de manzanas. Unidad de los Trabajadores y operar maquinaria agrícola a la planta y cultivare, pulverización y cosecha de manzanas. Elimina exceso de crecimiento de los árboles para mejorar calidad de la fruta mediante poda sierras y clippers. Los trabajadores de tractores para transportar los materiales, suministros, o en el producto. Además, delgado flores o fruta inmadura para obtener mejores frutos de calidad. Otros recolectar frutas u otras responsabilidades, si es necesario.

Buscó cuidarlos tanto física como los trabajadores deben ser capaces de recoger fruta, la mayoría de lo que se hace de las escaleras con ramas inferiores se ha recogido del suelo. Los trabajadores colocar la escalera firmemente contra o en árbol en una posición segura para no romper las extremidades o desprender frutas y para evitar que se resbale o caiga. Todas las frutas que hay que tratar con cuidado para evitar causar magulladuras. Fruta se coloca en un marco metálico, de lienzo cubierto de lona recogida la cuchara con correas que pasan por encima de la cabeza y sobre los hombros. La cuchara llena pesos de hasta 42 kg y se vacía en las cajas a granel conocido como "descubiertas". Cada caja bolsón tiene una capacidad de veinte (20) bushels. Los trabajadores tienen que manejar las escaleras hasta 24 pies de largo y pesa aproximadamente 2 libras por pie. Trabajo de recolección de la manzana, los trabajadores pueden ser instrucciones de recogida selectiva fruto maduro de acuerdo a su tamaño, color y grado normas factores. Los trabajadores serán dirigidos a despojar de todo fruto de un árbol en un lugar de recogida o recogida selectiva (recogida) en función de su tamaño y color dependiendo de las condiciones del cultivo y el estado de madurez. Fruto recogido como gotas nunca mezclados con frutas de árbol. La productividad debe ser de al menos 4,8 contenedores por día de mercado de productos frescos las manzanas y de 6,75 contenedores por día para procesar las manzanas. Cada uno de los trabajadores la fruta será inspeccionado de acuerdo con las instrucciones dadas en cada día por el huerto capataz.

Los trabajadores también realizar cualquier combinación de las tareas involucradas en la siembra, el cultivo y la recolección de frutos como labranza del suelo, la siembra, poda árboles y arbustos, eliminando los chupones y los finalistas de los árboles, enredaderas y plantas. Otras funciones incluyen tendido de tuberías de riego y la instalación de rociadores, la asistencia en reparación cercas, descarga de camiones, desde la limpieza de los campos, quemando cepillo, frutos y manchas. Utilizar herramientas apropiadas, como palas, azadas, manipuladores, hoces y se rompe.

Empleador proporcionará a los trabajadores, sin costo, todas las herramientas y equipos necesarios para el desempeño de las funciones que se le asignan. Los trabajadores deben de trabajar con su propia ropa de trabajo adecuada. Campo temperaturas van de los 30 grados a 85 grados con húmedo mañana. Todos los solicitantes deberán contar con tres meses de experiencia en todas las tareas descritas en esta orden de trabajo.

INTRASTATE AND INTERSTATE CLEARANCE ORDER

The employer agrees to provide to workers referred through the clearance system the number of hours of work per week cited in Item 10 of the clearance order for the week beginning with the anticipated date of need, unless the employer has amended the date of need at least 10 working days prior to the original date of need by so notifying the Order-Holding Office (OHO). If the employer fails to notify the OHO at least 10 working days prior to the original date of need, the employer shall pay eligible workers referred through the intrastate/interstate clearance system the specified hourly rate or pay, or in the absence of a specified hourly rate or pay, the higher of the Federal or State minimum wage rate for the first week starting with the original anticipated date of need. The employer may require workers to perform alternative work if the guarantee is invoked and if such alternative work is stated on the job order.

The employer agrees that no extension of employment beyond the period of employment shown on the job order will relieve the employer from paying the wages already earned, or specified in the job order as a term of employment, providing transportation or paying transportation expenses to the worker's home.

The employer assures that all working conditions comply with applicable Federal and State minimum wage, child labor, social security, health and safety, farm labor contractor registration and other employment-related laws.



The employer, if acting as a farm labor contractor, has a valid farm labor contractor registration certificate.

The employer assures the availability of no cost or public housing which meets applicable Federal and State standards and which is sufficient to house the specified number of workers requested through the clearance system.

The employer also assures that outreach workers shall have reasonable access to the workers in the conduct of outreach activities pursuant to 20 CFR 653.107.

A: CLARIFICATION OF ITEMS ON FORM ETA 790

Item 2: Work-Site Locations

- Lakeside Orchards Barn – Corner of Wilson-Burt and Coomer Roads in Town of Newfane, next to camp (Route 78 North from Lockport, turn left on Wilson-Burt Road)
- Topp, McCoy & Tabor – South side of Lake Road (Route 18), in Town of Wilson, located between Beebe and Maple Roads (Route 78 North from Lockport, turn left on Lake Road (Route 18))
- McCoy-Beebe – West side of Beebe Road, just South of Lake Road (Route 18), in Town of Wilson (Route 78 North from Lockport, turn left on Lake Road (Route 18))
- Jankowski – Northwest corner of Wilson-Burt and West Creek Roads (about ¼-mile West of Route 78), in Town of Newfane
- Phillips-North – North side of Drake Settlement Road about ¼-mile East of Route 78, in Town of Newfane
- Phillips-South – South side of Drake Settlement Road about ¼-mile East of Route 78, in Town of Newfane
- Liddell – Behind barn and camp on corner of Wilson-Burt and Coomer Roads in Town of Newfane (Route 78 North from Lockport, turn left on Wilson-Burt Road)
- Willard – Corner of Wilson-Burt and Coomer Roads (across from camp) in Town of Newfane (Route 78 North from Lockport, turn left on Wilson-Burt Road)

Item 3: Housing

- a. Housing and utilities are provided at no cost to H-2A workers and those workers in corresponding employment who are unable to return to their place of residence the same day.
- b. Housing beds, bedding, and mattresses will be furnished at no cost to the workers.
- c. Housing will be clean and meet the applicable Federal and State housing standards.
- d. Workers will be responsible for maintaining housing and surrounding areas in a neat, clean manner.

Item 14: Board Arrangements

Employer will will not provide three meals per day and will deduct \$ N/A per day.

Employer will will not furnish free dishes, cooking utensils and convenient kitchen and cooking facilities.

Employer will will not provide transportation to assure workers access to stores where they can purchase groceries and/or other incidentals, and/or medical necessities.

- 3) Fails, after completing any training or break-in period, to reach production standards (if applicable); or
- 4) Abandons Job ("Job Abandonment") – is absent for five consecutive previously scheduled days without prior notification to employer.

Item 17: Wage Rates, Special Pay Information and Deductions

The employer will offer, advertise in its recruitment, and pay a wage that is the highest of the AEW, the prevailing hourly wage or piece rate, the agreed upon collective bargaining wage, or the Federal or State minimum wage, except where a special procedure is approved for an occupation or specific class of agricultural employment. Employer assures that if a change in the AEW requires an increase such increase will be paid as of the effective date of the increase. Also if the AEW is decreased this will become the wage effective on the date of the decrease.

- a. If piece rate earnings for total hours of work at a piece rate during a pay period do not result in average hourly earnings equal to the guaranteed minimum hourly rate, the worker will receive make-up pay to the guaranteed minimum wage rate.
- b. In New York State, the only deductions that can be taken from worker pay are:
 1. Those required by law, such as Social Security, income tax, and garnishment of wages; and
 2. Those that benefit workers and are authorized in writing, such as life insurance, or a savings account.

Any other deductions are illegal.

- c. The employer guarantees to offer employment for a minimum of $\frac{3}{4}$ ("three-fourths guarantee") of the hours in the workdays during the period of the contract, and all extensions thereof. This guarantee begins with the first workday after the worker's arrival at the place of employment and ends on the date specified on the job order or extensions thereof. In fire, weather, or Act of God terminations (as determined by the Certifying Officer) the $\frac{3}{4}$ guarantee period ends on the date of termination. The employer must make efforts to transfer the worker to other comparable employment acceptable to the worker, consistent with existing immigration law, as applicable. If such a transfer is not affected, the employer must (1) return the worker, at the employer's expense, to the place from which the worker (disregarding intervening employment) came to work for the employer, or transport the worker to the worker's next certified H-2A employer, whichever the worker prefers; (2) reimburse the worker the full amount of any deductions made from the worker's pay by the employer for transportation and subsistence expenses to the place of employment; and (3) pay the worker for any costs incurred by the worker for transportation and daily subsistence to that employer's place of employment. Daily subsistence must be computed as set forth in paragraph (h) of 655.122. The amount of the transportation payment must not be less (and is not required to be more) than the most economical and reasonable common carrier transportation charges for the distances involved provide the guarantees in Item 19 (a) below.
- d. Workers will not be required to work more than the number of hours specified in the job order for a workday or on their Sabbath or federal holidays to meet this guarantee. The worker's average hourly earnings will be used under this guarantee where wages are paid on a piece rate basis. Workers who are terminated for cause or who voluntarily abandon their job are not entitled to this guarantee if employer provides timely notification to the NPC and DHS.
- e. On or before each payday the employer will provide to each worker in one or more written statements the following information: (1) the worker's total earnings for the pay period; (2) the worker's hourly rate and/or piece rate of pay; (3) the hours of employment offered to the worker (showing offers in accordance with the $\frac{3}{4}$ guarantee as determined in paragraph (i) of the regulations at 20 CFR sec. 655.122(k), separate from any hours offered over and above the guarantee); (4) the hours actually worked by the worker; (5) an itemization of all deductions made from the worker's wages; (6) if piece rates are used, the units produced daily; (7) beginning and ending dates of the pay period; and (8) the employer's name, address, and FEIN.

- f. Workers with school age children who have migrated with such children and who depart in time to return home for the beginning of the school year shall be paid, in addition to the basic wages, any bonus or other incentive payments or other expenses to which they would be entitled had they stayed the entire job order period.
- g. The employer will provide workers referred through the interstate clearance system 48 hours of work for the week beginning with the anticipated date of need, unless employer has amended the date of need by notifying the SWA no later than 10 business days before the date of need. If the employer fails to notify the NYS Department of Labor, then the employer shall pay an eligible worker referred through the clearance system \$540.48 (number of hours of work x AEW/prevailing wage/minimum wage) for the first week starting with the originally anticipated date of need. If worker referred fails to notify the NYS Department of Labor of continued interest in the job at least 5 days before date of need, worker will be disqualified from this assurance. Employer will will not require worker to perform alternative work if the guarantee cited in this section is invoked.
Alternative work: Trim fruit trees, hand thin, weeding, hoeing, succoring and summer thinning. May also repair boxes.
- h. Employer will maintain adequate payroll records. Workers will be paid weekly on Friday for work through the previous Sunday.

Item 19: Transportation

Employer agrees to reimburse inbound transportation and subsistence expenses (\$11.86 per day minimum to a maximum of \$46.00 per day) to each worker, or any person, government agency, or private organization which, on behalf of the worker, has paid or advanced such transportation and subsistence expenses, from the place from which the worker has come to work for the employer, whether in the U.S. or abroad to the place of employment, after the worker has completed 50% of the stipulated period of employment, from initial date of need or from the day after actual arrival of worker if later than the stated date to report.

- a. Employer will provide or pay the cost of return transportation and subsistence to each worker who completes the employment period, or who is terminated for medical reasons, or as the result of fire, weather, or an Act of God (as determined by the Certifying Officer), from place of employment to place of recruitment, except if the worker prefers not to return to his place of recruitment and has subsequent employment with an employer – see Item 17 (c) above. Employer will not be responsible for providing return cost of transportation and subsistence from place of employment to place of recruitment if the worker voluntarily abandons the job or is terminated for cause and employer provides timely notification to the NPC and DHS.
- b. The amount of the transportation payment will be equal to the most economical and reasonable similar common carrier transportation charges for the distance involved. All transportation provided by the employer will be by common carrier or other transportation facilities which conform to the applicable regulations of the Interstate Commerce Commission or the United States Department of Labor. The amount of daily subsistence will be in accordance with current rates published in the *Federal Register* (for workers with and without receipts).
- c. If requested by the worker, employer will assist in making transportation arrangements.
- d. Employer will provide transportation, at no cost to the worker, from the employer provided housing to the actual work site and return at the end of the day.

Item 22: Workers' Compensation


The employer assures that Policy # Z 2070 949-9 issued by The State Insurance Fund provides the required insurance for injuries arising out of and in the course of employment. Employer's proof of insurance coverage will be provided to the Chicago Processing Center before certification is granted.

Item 23: Tools and Equipment

The employer will furnish without cost all tools, supplies, or equipment required in the performance of work.

B: OTHER CLARIFICATIONS AND ASSURANCES

1. The employer agrees to abide by the regulations at 20 CFR 653.501 and 20 CFR 655.135.
2. The employer will expeditiously notify the State agency by telephone immediately upon learning that a crop is maturing earlier or later, or that weather conditions, over-recruitment, or other factors have changed the terms and conditions of employment.
3. Outreach workers shall have reasonable access to the worker in the conduct of outreach activities pursuant to 20 CFR 653.501(xvi).
4. Where appropriate, the employer is certified in the use and application of pesticides per Federal Environmental Protection Agency and State Department of Environmental Conservation requirements. The employer assures that workers hired under this order who will be handling pesticides will be provided appropriate training.
5. The employer will provide to an H-2A worker no later than the time at which the worker applies for the visa, or to a worker in corresponding employment no later than on the day work commences, a copy of the work contract between the employer and the workers in a language understood by the worker.
6. The employer assures that if acting as a farm labor contractor (FLC) or farm labor contractor employee (FLCE) on the order, he/she has a valid federal FLC certificate or FLCE identification card.
7. The applicant assures that he/she complies with NYS registration requirements. Farm labor contractors anticipating employment contracting with growers or processors in New York State, growers or processors in New York State who use the services of a farm labor contractor, and growers or processors in New York State who, without using the services of a farm labor contractor, are responsible for bringing into the state five or more out-of-state migrant farm or food processing workers, **not including H-2A workers**, are required to register with the New York State Department of Labor ~~and pay a registration fee in addition to any other fees that may be applicable.~~ This statement applies only to H-2A employers who also employ five or more out-of-state migrant workers.
