The Work Readiness Credential (WRC), developed by the National Work Readiness Council (NWRC), is an invaluable tool in both preparing job seekers for entry-level work, and providing employers with a more competent and skilled workforce with which to help meet their basic business needs.

Labor experts have narrowed down eight basic skills considered essential for on-the-job efficiency and success, all based on the Equipped for the Future standards. In just two and a

half hours, the assessment, divided into four modules, measures a candidate's ability to:

1. Listen actively
2. Solve problems and make decisions
3. Cooperate with others
4. Resolve conflicts and negotiate
5. Observe critically
6. Take responsibility for learning
7. Read with understanding
8. Solve problems using math

Achievement of the WRC enhances the marketability of entry-level job
